Vitto Blocks





Vitto blocks, a 3d printed toy designed by toysinbox, is a very fun and safe construction toy. It consists of four connected triangular pyramids with four holes at the bottom. They are intended to stack on top of each other. You can stack the pieces to create a 2d or 3d shape. Right now, Vitto blocks is not for commercial sale and is still being revised and being cleaned up a bit. It was designed by toysinbox 3d printing designer Joshua Yang. We are planning to sell vitto blocks in the future. It was designed in tinkercad and had a major change. The pointy tips of each triangular pyramid have been removed and substituted with flat, more child-friendly tips that don't pose a poking/pointing hazard. We absolutely can't wait until we release it for commercial sale.

How to Make a Ornament Using Scrap Paper

If you have an old and unwanted small book, remove the cover and the back cover and skip to step 3.

Step 1. Cut a bunch of rectangles and fold them in half.

Step 2. Sew the rectangles right down the middle together.

Step 3 Step 4. Fold the bottom right

conner so that the corner is touching the middle line.

Step 5 Step 6. Fold the top right corner to the middle to form a triangle.

Step 7 Step 8. Repeat until you run out of paper to fold. You have completed the paper ornament!
